ORDER OF SPECIAL MASTER

Upon consideration of motion of the California defendants for an order requiring intervener, the United States of America, to produce and permit the inspection and copying or photographing by defendants of certain documents in the possession, custody or control of the intervener,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That intervener produce and permit the defendants to inspect and copy or photograph all indices in the possession of the Department of Interior or the National Archives and Records relating to materials deposited in the National Archives and Records with respect to the following subjects for the period 1900-1944:

- a. Colorado River Compact,
- b. Boulder Canyon Project Act,
- c. Colorado River Project,
- d. United States Government reclamation and power projects within the Colorado River Basin,
- e. United States Government reclamation projects located anywhere in the United States;

(2) That intervener produce and permit the defendants to inspect and copy or photograph any books, reports, studies, letters and data presently deposited in the National Archives and Records relating to any of the subjects described above for the period 1900 through 1929;

(3) That intervener produce and permit the defendants to inspect and copy or photograph any books, reports, studies, letters and data presently deposited in the National Archives and Records relating to any of the subjects described above for the period 1930 through 1944, provided that defendants specify in advance the particular materials they desire to inspect. If the index to these materials is not adequate for the purpose of specifying the particular documents desired, defendants may, upon proper application, move for an order requiring intervener to make all materials relating to the period 1930 through 1944 available for inspection and copying;

(4) That defendants supply intervener with a list of all the documents of which copies or photographs are made;

(5) That said documents be made available to the defendants no later than June 27, 1956, or at such other day as is agreed upon by the parties;

(6) That defendants may withdraw documents from the possession of intervener for the purpose of having them photostated and return them immediately thereafter, or the intervener, at its election, may photostat such documents for the defendants and at defendants' expense.
